

What can I say about last week's 3-0 reversal in the John Reilly Memorial Trophy versus Stonehaven? I really can't recall in a long time witnessing a poorer performance than that we produced last Saturday. Or should I say failed to produce, especially in the first period when players who are usually comfortable in possession and use the ball well, looked as if they hadn't seen a ball before. We constantly humped the ball up the park in hope and players constantly putting the ball out the park under little pressure. I thought I was at Murrayfield.

There is no doubt we deserved to lose the game and no disrespect to our opponents but they were in no way a quality side. That is the evidence to our players that Carnoustie are a side playing with confidence and well capable of beating any side in our division. However, we somewhat erased the memory of last Saturday with our midweek win but we'll have to be at our best if we are to triumph this afternoon. Enjoy the game.

TAYPORT ARE EURO CHAMPS!

A.C. OUGREE..... 0
TAYPORT 4

TAYPORT lifted the trophy in an eight-club international amateur tournament in Belgium last Monday.

As well as receiving the huge Jacques Van-debosh Trophy, Tayport lifted several other awards. Alan Harte won the award for the best player of the tournament and the award for the best young player of the tournament went to Tayport's Phillip Smith.

The trophy for the team with the best defence of the tournament also went to the Scottish club who had conceded only one goal in their three games.

The weather in Liege was very windy. Both opening games were played in heavy rain showers which turned the pitch into a muddy morass. The final at 4.30 p.m. on Monday afternoon was also played in fairly disagreeable conditions.

Instead of getting better, the weather got worse, and on the Tuesday morning Tayport's arrival at the airport at Liege was delayed because of a blizzard which made road conditions very tricky on the journey from their base in the hills south of Liege on the road to Luvering.

The Tayport party were based at a holiday camp in the picturesque town of Pouffeux some 25 kilometres from Liege but had a smart coach at their disposal for the trips into Liege for the matches.

OPENING TIE

Tayport were faced with Liege and District first division side Cointe in their opening fixture at 9.45 a.m. on Sunday morning and got the verdict by the odd goal in three against skillful opposition.

Tayport had Angus Charly in goal and Barrie Toner lined up in midfield. Colin Grey was at left back for Rab Downie who was on the bench with Bruce Burnett, Neil Downie and Kenny Smith. Ian Howe put Tayport ahead after 10 minutes. After a job from Kevin Murphy had come back off the bar, Howe was on the spot to head home. Cointe were soon level.

Bobby Wilson conceded a free kick for which he was severely warned (being warned Tayport's chances of the fair play trophy). De Lapina swerved the ball past the wall and wide of Charly for the equaliser.

Tayport's winner late in the second half was also scored by the experience Howe who crashed Murphy's pass past the keeper.

SECOND TIE

ROANA..... 0

Tayport made heavy weather of beating the Italian side Roana, who had disposed of the German side and Tayport who were massed in their opening tie, the same afternoon. Tayport had all the pressure but some great goalkeeping and desperate defending kept the Scots at bay.

The Italians, relying on the

chance of a breakaway goal, eventually cracked ten minutes from time when a fierce free kick from right back Phil Smith was deflected past Roana's keeper.

With two wins out of two, Tayport were in Monday afternoon's final. Host club A.C. Ougree were the other finalists. Ougree had caused an upset in their semi final with a last minute goal to pip the favourites, Spanish side Granada, by 1-0. Ougree's winner caused amazing scenes with the scorer being immersed under a pile of bodies made up of his ten team mates including the goalkeeper. French club Lille were defeated 1-0 in Ougree's opener.

Despite changeable weather conditions, a sizeable crowd had paid to see the final between the local side and Tayport who were again unchanged - A. Charly; P. Smith, A. Hart, B. Wilson, C. Grey; G. Malone, J. Bisset, B. Toner; A. Harte, K. Murphy, I. Howe; Subs: R. Downie, N. Downie, B. Burnett, K. Smith.

The muddy pitch had been rolled flat and was in reasonable condition as the teams lined up for the 'finalists' national anthems and presentation to the mayor.

Tayport stunned the home support with a blistering start to go 3-0 ahead in 25 minutes. Kevin Murphy, who was in fine form, netted twice and Alan Harte hit the third with a sweeping 25 yard drive which was the icing on a great first half performance from the Tayport lads.

Cogree put Tayport under heavy pressure from the first whistle of the second half. Tayport replaced Gray with Rob Downie as the Belgians fought hard to reduce the lead, bringing on both substitutes.

With 15 minutes left R. Downie and a home defender were injured after clashing while challenging for a 50/50 ball. Both were stretchered off and taken to hospital by ambulance where Downie's leg was found to have sustained a broken leg.

Downie's X-ray showed no break in the bone and he was released in time to go home with his team mates.

After a delay, the final resumed and Tayport, with K. Smith on as substitute, turned on the style against their main opponents. Murphy capped a notable display with a fourth goal to complete his hat-trick after having earlier been fouled by the save of the tournament from the Ougree goalkeeper.

A 'great' tournament for Tayport, clouded slightly when it was discovered that the trophy had been damaged by the baggage handlers at Heathrow Airport.

Tayport are back in domestic action this weekend with a league game away to St. James at Drumgeeth. The Alliance side are away to Kingsway in a league game. The Fife side are unlikely to have a game. Players meet pavilion at 1.30 p.m.

Next Thursday Tayport are in the North of Tay Cup semi final versus Innes F.P. at East End Park, Dundee. Kick-off 6.45 p.m. Meet pavilion at 5.45 p.m.

If this fixture had been played during the first four months of the season, then Tayport would be odds on to collect the points. Between 20th August, when Tayport won 3-0 at Laing Park, and 12 November when Tayport won 3-0 at home vs the Gowfers, Carnoustie's league form was dreadful, nine league defeats and one win at Letham. Tayport's by contrast had been pretty impressive during that same period, nine wins, two draws and a single defeat by Lochee United.

Fast forward to the past few weeks and Carnoustie have beaten Downfield 6-2, Lochee Harp 2-1 and last week won 4-2 at Lochee United. Tayport meanwhile have shipped 14 goals during the same period, most recently 3 against bottom of the League Letham on Wednesday evening.



It's clear, that despite the 10 goals at Letham, unless Tayport take a shake to themselves defensively, Carnoustie will be confident of further eroding the present 14 points differential between the sides in a bid to finish in the top five.

George Johnston (pictured) was the goalscoring hero last week, netting a hat-trick in the surprise 4-2 win at Lochee United where Tayport had lost five goals only a week earlier.

Tayport lacked finishing power against Stonehaven last Saturday but found the road to goal again with a vengeance in their 10-3 win in Perth. Dale Reid returned to action with four goals and Ethan Samson, with a hat-trick, was on the mark for the first time since December.

It's now eleven seasons since Tayport had their hands on some silverware. That situation hasn't changed. Any league hopes ended a while ago and this defeat ending any hopes of a cup success. And so another barren season for Tayport is confirmed.

Defensive frailties contributed to the loss of two goals in the opening half hour and gave us a mountain to climb. In 1959 they became one of the few Second Division Clubs to win the Bremner Cup.

They would have to wait until 1964 for their next silverware, lifting the Carne Trophy and they had success in the same competition in 1967.

They won the Division Two title in 1969 and became an established Division One side in the 70s and 80s.

They suffered heartache in the Gray Trophy losing 3 successive finals in the 1970s, but did get their name etched on the Trophy in 1978.

The Bremner Cup was added to their list of honours in 1979, before they secured their only Division One title in 1982, pipping SMT on "goal average" after both teams had finished level on points.

1986 was their most memorable campaign, reaching the semi final of the Scottish Cup v Barr & Stroud at Dens park in front of a

crowd of 1500 people. Leading 1-0 at half time an injury to talisman centre half Alan Gray proved costly and Tayport went down by 3 goals to 1.

The backbone of the club in the formative years included the likes of Jim Mathers, Abby Walker, Davie Hughes and Fred Janssen, and post 1970 the mantle was taken on by stalwarts such as Abby Oswald, Iain Cougan, John Anderson, Sandy McDade, Eck Beat, Ron Redpath and the now departed gents Eddie Stewart, Alastair (HerCs) Oswald, Ross MacMillan and Andy (Bunt) Robertson.

Ex Dundee players Bobby Waddell, Eric Sinclair and Hugh Robertson were heavily involved with the coaching at Tayport FC, and Drew Herd wore many different hats as physio, player, coach, scout and was the man with "all the contacts".

Maurice Milne (DUFC, Norwich & Brechin), Gordon (Gus) Malone (Brechin & Cowdenbeath), Phil Smith (Forfar), Bobby Wilson (Brechin) and Wille (Molly) Brown (St Johnstone & East Fife) all joined the Senior Ranks.
